



Increase in voter turnout

Comparison of Mayoral Primary Voting from 2013 and 2021

In 2021, Anash voter turnout increased by 200% among those registered in 2013. When we include newly registered voters, the increase surpassed 400%



Eric Adams won the 2021 mayoral primary in the final round with 404,513 votes, beating Kathryn Garcia, who had 397,316 votes. Adams had only 7,197 more votes than Garcia.







Hypothetically, If Hollingsworth had received the Anash votes, he would have won














JFA Voter Database

Every vote in Crown Heights matters, so the JFA is tirelessly and meticulously working to ensure that everyone eligible to vote is registered and casts their vote.





We gather our information from public records and match it with Anash residents, continually updating our database. Our private database displays Anash voting history, party affiliation, and contact information



We are working with a sophisticated platform that can help us look at data.

Our program enables us to map Anash voters based on voting records, name, registration, party affiliation, age, and addresses, and to create turfs to assist with the Get Out the Vote (GOTV) effort.
