Foreword

We hereby present Issue 67 of Rebbe Responsa, a compilation of letters authored by the Lubavitcher Rebbe in English.

This Shabbos, the 20th of Av, marks the 80th anniversary of the Passing of the Rebbe's father, Rabbi Levi Yitzchok Schneerson.

In this week's booklet you will find a collection of letters concerning Congregation Levi Yitzchok of Hollandale, Florida, a shul named for the Rebbe's father. Most of the letters are addressed to the Shul's founder, Mr. Moshe Mordechai (Marvin) Shuster and his wife Chana (Susan).

In an interview, Mrs. Shuster recounts: "We had a minyan in our house with complete prayer services every Shabbat, which eventually led to my husband buying a house and having it converted into a synagogue." Around the time of the move (in 5741)2 the Rebbe gave his approval for the name of the congregation to be changed from Beis Hakneses Shomrei-Hadas - Chabad, to Congregation Levi Yitzchok -Lubavitch.3

In the following letters, the Rebbe guides the Shusters through the challenges their newly formed congregation faced and defines its mission. In a letter written to the Shul's president in 5745, the Rebbe draws on the life of the congregation's namesake:4

My father of saintly memory, after whom your congregation is named, exemplified such real Mesiras-Nefesh for the preservation of Yiddishkeit under the most

trying conditions, suffering persecution and exile, and inspiring many Jews to follow his example. Here in the U.S.A. etc. G-d gave us the possibility to practice all this without any difficulties at all and many times - even with the encouragement of the environment. Therefore, I trust and am sure each and all members and friends of Congregation Levi Yitzchok-Lubavitch will be continuously inspired, too, to help make the Congregation a model of what a Jewish congregation should be like.⁵

Greeting and Blessing:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 8 Shevat, with enclosures. Many thanks for the good news it contained about the progress of the Congregation and forthcoming events, including the fourth annual dinner set for the 26th of Shevat.

Significantly, the event is taking place immediately after Shabbos Parshas Shekalim, the theme of which is the half-shekel contribution "To make atonement for your souls" (לכפר על נפשותיכם).6

One of the eternal lessons of this annual contribution of the half shekel - neither more nor less, by rich and poor alike, is that every Jew - rich and poor, scholar and layman is equally dear to HaShem - because deep in one's heart and soul every Jew is attached to HaShem, to the highest degree of Mesiras-Nefesh for His Torah and Mitzyos.

The half-shekel is certainly no measure of a Jew's devotion to HaShem. But HaShem requested a tangible expression of it in terms of money, to show how a Jew, every Jew, is capable of

converting a silver coin into a **matbe'a shel esh**, a "fiery coin," similar to the one HaShem showed to Moshe Rabbeinu, as the Medrash explains.⁷

Therefore, I trust and am sure each and all members and friends of Congregation Levi Yitzchok-Lubavitch will be continuously inspired, too, to help make the Congregation a model of what a Jewish congregation should be like.⁸

May you proceed in this direction from strength to strength, in **continuous growth and fruit-bearing**, in keeping with the message of the New Year For Trees which we just observed.

Greeting and Blessing:

This¹² brings me to the subject of the Congregation Levi Yitzchok which you have founded.

Due to the intervening festival of Shovuos, this is my first opportunity to acknowledge receipt of your letter and design of the stationery of the newly founded Cong. Levi Yitzchok. The design makes a very good impression. As for suggestions in this connection, I would only like to suggest that you add "U.S.A." in the address, inasmuch as, in accordance with the slogan of "Uforatzto" on the stationery, the Congregation will, hopefully, establish contacts also with Jews coming from other countries.

With reference to the matter of harassment which the new Congregation has experienced, as you mention in your letter, you are, of course, right that it should be reported to the police. However, there is no room for apprehension. Indeed, it is a sign that the influence of the new Congregation has already made an

impact, and, as it happened with similar situations in various other places, the original resistance gradually subsided. Needless to say, you and all who are active in promoting this Congregation will surely continue to do so, and even more energetically. This will also answer your question what is to be done. For, having introduced Orthodoxy in your neighborhood is only the first step in the direction of making the whole neighborhood permeated with Torah and Mitzvoth, to the extent that HaShem will be able to say, "I will dwell in their midst." 13 In other words, the Congregation should become a lighthouse, illuminating the homes of all its members, and through them neighbors and friends, with the light and vitality of the Torah and Mitzvoth. All the more so since Greater Miami Beach attracts Jews from different cities and countries, and thus has the opportunity to extend its influence far and wide.14

Wishing you Hatzlocho in all above, and may the forthcoming Chag HaGeulo bring you and yours, and all of us, an additional measure of Geulo, and, indeed, hasten the complete Geulo of our Jewish people through Moshiach Tzidkeinu.

Greeting and Blessing!

In response to the notification of the forthcoming Dinner, taking place on Sunday, the 3rd of Adar II, I extend congratulations to the Honorees, Chairman, Co-Chairmen, distinguished guests and all friends of Congregation Levi Yitzchok — Lubavitch, on reaching this significant milestone.

Especially so since the current Jewish year is a **Leap Year**.

The significance of a Leap Year has been explained on previous occasions,¹⁷ as have the practical lessons we can learn from it. We shall here discuss one point that especially relates to this gathering: the subject of "giver" - the sun - and "receiver" the moon. During a Leap-Year the two meet together, thereby reconciling the difference between the solar year and lunar year, and accomplishing the Divine intention that Pesach always be in the Month of Aviv – springtime.

The main point of this is that, through the mutual effect upon each other, namely the "giver" and "receiver" — the "giver" simultaneously also being a "receiver" and the "receiver" also a "giver" — the two become one, thereby fulfilling the Divine design for both of them, and for the world as a whole.

This point is particularly outstanding in regard to outreach activities, where the "giving" is primarily from the "Giver" — to the one who is the "Receiver." That is why it is especially important that the "giving" be in the fullest possible measure, quantitatively and qualitatively: the Torah and Mitzvos implanted in the receiver should not be merely by force of habit, but should permeate their thoughts, speech and actual deeds so that this is reflected in his daily conduct — in fear of G-d, improved character traits and so on, so that it be evident — at home, at shul and also in the street —that this is a product of an activity on high standards of holiness.

In order that the "giving" be even more complete, givers, educators and counselors should bear in mind that they are, at the same time, also "receivers" — and to a tremendous extent, incomparably more than the effort and work they invest in their students. Indeed, who can estimate the merit and reward associated with the sacred work of assisting the Almighty's "kinder," children of the Supreme King of Kings, the Holy One, blessed be He?

However, in order that the ¹⁸ these activities be able to fulfill its responsibilities in the best possible way, it has to rely upon yet another class of "givers" — Torah-supporters who understand the value of Torah education and the preciousness of Jewish men, women and children.

With all the above in mind, I am confident that each and all of the participants will take the fullest advantage of the enormous opportunities that you have to expand and intensify the ongoing activities and programs of Congregation Levi Yitzchok — Lubavitch.
